### REPORT

For the 2015 Model Year of Harley-Davidson we will have a new Learner Approved Motorcycle namely the "Street 500". It will be available in gloss black, denim black or dark red. We hope to be selling this bike in January 2015 for approximately \$12,000 ride away. We have already taken a deposit on the first one available which is a good sign. The bike is good looking and technically innovative. It is a V Twin with water cooling and 4 valves per cylinder as well as fuel injection. Harley-Davidson already has a good range of bolt on accessories for this bike so people will be able to design their own custom with wheels, paint, chrome and other items such as carriers.

While we were at the Summer Dealer meeting held in Nashville I had the honour of being one of 15 Australian Dealers to take the Electric Harley-Davidson for a test ride. It is called the "Live Wire" and is a complete departure from anything Harley-Davidson has ever done. What impressed me about the ride was the absence of a clutch or gears. It creates a whirring sound similar to a jet engine when underway, and it has amazing torque from very slow speed. It is quick it is easily as fast as a V Rod and nimble like a Buell. They have built 34 for testing and evaluation and have been receiving surprisingly good feedback from all test riders.

The rest of the Harley-Davidson range remains stable, but the factory has been refining the core models and the improvements really matter. We are aiming as a 4% increase in new bike sales so I hope you come in and help us achieve target by buying a new toy for the stable.

**Safety Officer:** Looking at rider training in May 2015, advanced cornering and breaking. This is offered by stay upright at the Mako track in Mareeba. This has been well attended in the past and is open to old and new members, even as a refresher for members who have attended in the past. Stay upright usually offers a discount depending on the numbers and the club has subsidised and will subsidise future training as it is highly recommended.

Chopper informed the meeting that as the safety officer before each monthly club ride he will have a sentence on safety, nothing too cumbersome just a reminder. This month is a reminder on your tyres, the pressure and wear. Especially for riders who don't ride often but everybody should do a quick check before riding.

Jan/Feb 2015 Harley will introduce the Street 500, retail \$11-12,000.Learner approved, manufactured in India but assembled in the US. Release 1500 in first year.

As Safety Officer, i would like to make members aware of the importance of safety while group riding. As enjoyable as it is riding with mates, we all need to understand the potential hazards that come with it.

I think the most important issue is to ride with a 2 second gap between you and the rider in front of you. This will enable you to take evasive action or an area for braking if required. Also if riding in rain allow a 4 second gap, and carry appropriate wet weather gear helps, with the wet season coming soon!

Something else to consider is tyre pressure and wear which can be easily overlooked if not riding regularly. Also, regular servicing can detect potential issues with reliability.

This report is not about blaming or witch hunting, it's all about safety awareness!
