
The Knucklehead exhaust has genuine 1950's "Superior" brand custom mufflers. Chris has had the bike for 25 years.

SpongeBob's Anzac Memorial Ride & Spectacular High Speed Acrobatic Display

On behalf of the committee and all 18 people on SpongeBob's ride on Sunday 23rd April I'd like to express our heartfelt gratitude to Wayne and Rhonda who went well above and beyond expectations in organizing and bringing the two Harley Magic Utes to the crash site on the Palmerston Highway.

Four bikes went down, two were written off, and three riders were injured requiring ambulances.

SpongeBob suffered the most extensive injuries; multiple breaks to several ribs, plus his collarbone, shoulder and pride. Squeak suffered mostly bruising to his body but not to his pride because



fortunately he sells houses and admits he often chases customers down the street, so he doesn't have too much pride to start with. That's a hell of a way to trade in your bike Squeak, on a trailer squished like a dead cockroach.

Our newest member, Shaun injured his ankle but not his bike, clearly a sign of a man who respects his Harley. It was his first HOG ride; let's hope it's not his last. Safety Officer Tem also went down but he was able to ride home like a good martini, shaken but not stirred.

There was no phone or satellite reception so someone had to ride toward Innisfail to get reception and call for help. Police who attended the site complimented the HOG members for their professionalism in directing traffic, assisting the injured, and organising the recovery vehicles. Usually in situations like this a tow truck drags the bikes onto the tray with chains.

All the more reason we are so indebted to Wayne and Rhonda, who voluntarily spent many hours organising the two Utes and driving to the site, retrieving the two wrecks and Shaun's bike and taking them directly to the shop for safe-keeping. Considering the part of the world we live in and all the activities there are to enjoy, it's a blessing that they were available.

Have you checked out the new Milwaukee 8? Tim has sold 6 so far, and the little 500 is still a

popular selling bike.

There is now a new version of the 750 available and Harley have released it into the Australian market. It has a more powerful motor than the early overseas releases and an improved suspension and twin disc brakes up front.

At around \$13,000 it's a great bike for those who



want more than the 500 offers but don't want a Sportster. (Why would anyone <u>not</u> want a Sportster? It's the longest production line motor in the Harley stable and has an enviable record on and off the race track) Anyway there is now a "middle-ground" 750c.c. option, check it out when you are in looking at the Milwaukee 8, they're both parked fairly close to the Sportsters.

On a serious note, Rhonda's been busy with Harley Magic and Water St making sure everything runs smoothly while Wayne's been away and putting in long hours with few breaks in between. They are both looking forward to good turn-out for the fund-raising Motorcycle Muster in August.

Overall things in Cairns are bit guiet right now, so it's a good time to get your bike serviced at Harley Magic before the rush of visitors coming for the Chapter Challenge. There are a lot riders attending from Mackay and Townsville and we've had inquiries from riders in other towns. Have you registered yet? There's less than a fortnight to go, so get those clutches adjusted, belts tensioned and tyres pumped up

One thing I can reassure you is the price of genuine Harley Oil is better than other brands that I've checked out at other bike shops. Harley "spin on" oil filters are cheaper and better too, so if you can't get your bike booked in on time and can do the easy things yourself as a temporary measure use the genuine stuff, and while you're at it the funky little funnel for topping up transmission oil is a bargain. They work a lot better than the one Angelique from Mozambique used to have in the kitchen...."I don't know where it's gone dear, why would I ever need it?"


















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Then Came Bronson

(Opening scene...busy city street...a harried businessman at a stoplight turns to his left, where a young man is revving his motorcycle, and asks...)

"Taking a trip?"

"What's that?" "Taking a trip?"

"Yeah."

"Where to?"

"Oh, I don't know...wherever I end up, I guess."

"Pal, I wish I was you."

"Really?...well, hang in there."



I couldn't resist sharing this cartoon about Bronson from the 1969 T.V series "Then came Bronson". The series began with a movie pilot that was screened in Europe and Australia. I saw it at the Rex Theatre in Cairns, but I can't remember when. Knowing how far behind we are up here I think it was the early '70's.

Bronson was a journalist who inherited a Sportster from a friend who suicided, which lead him to explore life for meaning (trippy hey, and he rode a Sportster). You can find the movie and episodes of the series on YouTube.

Bronson's bike started a cult with many riders copying it, so if you want a laugh Google Bronson's Harley. He rode a 1969 XLH 900c.c. and unlike most XLHs his was fitted with a kick-starter as well as the electric starter, and an XLCH peanut fuel tank instead of the bulky XLH "turtle" tank. Don't worry about the details, only Sportster fanatics bother with details. What prompted this page was the parody from Mad comics, printed around the same time. It cracks me up. Enjoy, safe riding.
